Quantum Leap Sports Agency Launches at Howard Theatre With Black Athlete Leadership Town Hall

New agency positions Black athletes as builders and owners in the sports economy, not just talent on the field — public panel discussion set for September 15 in Washington, D.C.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Quantum Leap Sports Agency (QLSA) today announced its formation, a new sports agency model built to coach, mentor, and develop the non-sport ambitions of its athletes — including their political voice. The agency will publicly introduce itself at the **Black Athlete Leadership Town Hall: The Future of Black Athlete Leadership Panel Discussion**, a public panel discussion on September 15, 2026, at the historic Howard Theatre in Washington, D.C.

“For generations, Black athletes have driven the sports economy without holding a stake in it — filling the stadiums, driving the ratings, selling the shoes and the subscriptions,” said Troy Mosley, founder of Quantum Leap Sports Agency. “We are building the infrastructure for athletes to walk away from the game as owners, not just as players who were once famous. That means mentorship, business development, and helping them find their political voice — while they still have the platform to use it.”

QLSA describes itself as a disruptor in the traditional agency model, built around the idea that Black athletes are consistently positioned as commodities — celebrated as players, marketed as personalities — but rarely supported as builders with permanent control over the institutions their talent sustains. The September 15 town hall is the agency’s first public event and the starting point for an ongoing series of conversations the agency plans to hold in the lead-up to the 2026 midterm elections.

The panel discussion will be held in a town hall format with audience Q&A. Confirmed panelists to date include Troy Mosley, founder, QLSA; Jazmyn Barrow, founding attorney, J. Barrow Legal LLC; Richard Brookshire and Kyle Bibby, cofounders, Black Veterans Project; Joe Briggs, NFL Players Association and adjunct professor, Georgetown University; and Julian Smith, Howard University College of Dentistry, NCAA and American 100-yard breaststroke record holder.

Attendees will be encouraged to register to vote and to confirm their current voter registration status on-site, consistent with QLSA’s mission of developing athletes’ civic and political voice. QLSA is a nonpartisan organization and does not endorse candidates or political parties.

Quantum Leap Sports Agency (QLSA) is a sports agency built on Black athlete leadership and coalition-building. QLSA provides the infrastructure — coaching, mentorship, and business development — to help athletes build ambitions beyond their sport, including entrepreneurship, civic engagement, and political voice, positioning them as long-term builders and owners rather than short-term talent.

TROY MOSLEY

Founder, Quantum Leap Sports Agency

Troy Mosley is the founder of Quantum Leap Sports Agency (QLSA), a new agency model built to develop Black athletes as builders and owners rather than short-term talent. A U.S. Army veteran and author of *Unwritten Truce: The Armed Forces and American Social Justice*, Mosley founded QLSA to provide the coaching, mentorship, and business development that help athletes extend their ambitions beyond the field — into entrepreneurship, civic engagement, and political voice. He convenes the Black Athlete Leadership Town Hall as QLSA's public launch and the first in an ongoing series of conversations through the 2026 midterm elections.



JAZMYN BARROW

Founding Attorney, J. Barrow Legal LLC

Jazmyn Barrow is the founding attorney of J. Barrow Legal LLC. A graduate of Case Western Reserve University School of Law, she is a labor and employment attorney who previously served as a Shareholder at Ogletree Deakins, one of the nation's largest labor and employment firms, before launching her own practice. Barrow brings a legal and advocacy lens to conversations on athlete rights, representation, and ownership.



RICHARD BROOKSHIRE

Cofounder, Black Veterans Project

Richard Brookshire is a cofounder of the Black Veterans Project, an organization dedicated to documenting and advancing the history, rights, and equity of Black veterans. An Afghanistan war veteran, Brookshire has been a leading advocate for addressing racial disparities in veterans' benefits and military service, bridging veteran advocacy, civil rights, and economic justice.



KYLE BIBBY

Cofounder, Black Veterans Project

Kyle Bibby is a cofounder of the Black Veterans Project and a U.S. Marine Corps veteran, having served as an infantry officer from 2007 to 2012. A longtime organizer and advocate, he has worked on campaigns addressing racial justice, veterans' rights, and military accountability. Bibby's advocacy centers on equity for Black service members and veterans, connecting military service to the broader movement for civil and economic rights.



JOE BRIGGS

Adjunct Professor, Georgetown University · Former Public Policy Counsel, NFL Players Association

Joe Briggs is an adjunct professor at Georgetown University and the former Public Policy Counsel for the NFL Players Association (NFLPA), where he worked at the intersection of law, labor, and player advocacy. A former college football player at Texas Christian University (TCU), Briggs brings both athletic and legal expertise to questions of athlete rights, representation, and the policy landscape shaping professional sports.



JULIAN SMITH

Former Division I Swimmer · Incoming Student, Howard University College of Dentistry

Julian Smith is a former Division I swimmer who competed at the University of Florida, where he set NCAA and American records in the 100-yard breaststroke. This fall, Smith begins his studies at the Howard University College of Dentistry. His path — from record-setting athlete in an underrepresented sport to a demanding professional career beyond competition — embodies the builder-and-owner ethos at the heart of the Town Hall.
